Raffle prizes Saturday night during awards


Poker Hands Saturday

A few reminders:

- *no trotting/cantering between obstacles.
- *no loose dogs on trail
- *no smoking or alcohol

Please be considerate of public lands and pick up litter.

When you arrive you will pick up your packet. In your packet you will find:

- *Your "Entry Number" Please display on you are your horse.
- *A brochure on high country manners
- *Backcountry Horseman Application form.

Before you begin your Trail Trial ride be sure you have the following on your horse or on your person:

Hoof Pick

A supply of water

Lead rope

Knife(not required for children)

Halter on your horse

Pair of pliers or letterman type knife

*Children must wear approved equestrian helmets

*First Aid Kit is recommended, but not required.

On Saturday evening (time to be announced) a one hour free workshop on Equine Wilderness First Aide being put on by Dr. Komo, one of our local Veterinarians. Dr. Komo will be at the event unless called away on an emergency.

We will also have a guided ride through some of the historical sites (time to be announced)
