Custom belt buckle for overall two-day low point in Novice, Intermediate, Advance Categories. Must ride both days.

The trail will include moderate climbs on single track trail and fire roads. Horses should be in good condition, but this is not a timed event. The trails are approximately 5 miles in length with 8-10 obstacles. Judging occurs only on the obstacles. Juniors (17 & Under) must be accompanied by an adult rider throughout the ride. Helmets are required for junior riders. No dogs on trails, must be on leash in camp. No dogs/horse in the registration or dining area. Water available, bring hoses and T's. Showers available. Camping in large grass meadow. Drive in is off Ice House Road on FS road 13N20.

Relax and Ride! Camping for this event from **Wednesday noon until Monday 11:00 am** and is \$15/night/rig.

**Entries may have to be limited depending on meadow conditions.**

Directions: From Highway 50 turn right onto Ice House Road if coming from Tahoe/Nevada or Left if coming from Sacramento. Travel north on Ice House Road approximately 25 miles toward Loon Lake. At mile marker 25 turn right onto Forest Service Road 13N20. Proceed about 2 miles thru the red gates at Stone Cellar. Trail trail and CSHA signs will be out. DRIVE SLOW (no dust!) thru the RV and cabin area to the big meadow. Drive slow thru the meadow to your camp spot. Please face your rig out toward the way you came in if parking In the middle. There is no physical address for Stone Cellar, don't rely on GPS. Ice House Store is about half way between Highway 50 and camp and is your only opportunity for ice, fuel or other supplies.

Outhouses on both ends of the meadow. Shower house is near where you enter the big meadow.

Plenty of high line opportunities on the outside edges but you must use tree savers. Water spigots are about every 50 feet along all the edges. No pens are available, you must bring your own.

Registration check in on Friday starting at 6pm, Saturday and Sunday at 8 am. Look for the Admin/Registration area.



Your pens, high line area or trailer tie must be cleaned daily. Do not spread manure!!!! Place in carts that will be located as near to camps as possible and these will be taken away each morning by 10am. All hay, trash and garbage must be removed before you leave.

The Rubicon River runs along the east side of camp. Sandy Beach is a short walk from the

meadow thru the cabin/rv area and includes some natural stone benches. Dogs and kids welcome, no horses.

Daily awards for 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup>, ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup>. Custom buckles for overall low point in Novice, Intermediate and Advanced category, must ride both days.

No hosing of horses. Conserve where you can.

Raffle Saturday night, please bring an item or two if you can.

Potluck Friday night near the Admin/Registration area, bring a dish to share and a chair. No other food will be available in camp.





Projections Photography will be shooting both days! Booth set up after each day's ride in the Admin/Reg area for you to review your shots available to purchase.

No dogs or horses in the Admin/Registration, potluck or awards area.

Camping will be open beginning Wednesday, July 6 at noon thru Monday July 11 for those that can come early and relax and ride. We hope to have maps and a few flagged trails. \$15 per night per rig.

Smoking is only allowed at your trailer, no smoking on trails.

Children are to be supervised by an adult at all times.

The meadow is at 5600 foot elevation and can be cool at night. Trails are high country forest , meadows and riverside trails and can be rocky. We recommend shoes or boots.

3 Releases attached, one for Stone Cellar and one for CSHA and a minor release for Stone Cellar.

## Basic Campground Rules - 2022

### **Mess Hall:** **There is no maid service. Clean up after yourself.**

- 1) In the evening, when you are through using the mess hall, please close the back window shutters and all the doors. The front window shutters may remain open.
- 2) Unless you are specifically requested to, do not lock any cabin or mess hall doors or windows.

### **Campfires:**

#### **1) Camp fires are at the discretion of Stone Cellar**

- 2) Use the fire pits provided. No new fire pits are to be dug or made.
- 3) Unless a portable metal fire pit is approved, campfires may only be made in the large campfire in front of the mess hall or in the metal fire ring in the big meadow. Please keep the fire in the big meadow small.
- 4) Firewood is available. Please do not cut your own.

#### **5) NO BONFIRES**

### **Horses:**

- 1) Horses should be high-lined with tree savers, corralled, or tied to trailer. No hobbling.
- 2) No horses or goats to be stabled or ridden/walked on cabin side of the road (including around the mess hall), in RV areas, or at Sandy Beach.
- 3) Due to water constraints, please use a water nozzle or a bucket of water to wash off horses. Please try to conserve water where you can
- 4) No horses or horse trailers/corrals within 20 feet of Memorial Tree in middle of big meadow. Please do not tie any animals to the fence around the tree.
- 5) Please be considerate of non-horse campsites. No horses or horse trailers/corrals within 20 feet of non-horse campsites, any roped off area, and any unmowed area.
- 6) Avoid the homestead area in the big meadow. There are nails and other metal objects in the ground that can damage tires and feet.
- 7) Manure should be put into provided trailers daily and on leaving. No manure is to be thrown in bushes, etc.
- 8) ALL manure, hay, alfalfa, and other feed in camping and grassy areas should be cleaned up before leaving.
- 9) If you value your horse, please do not race it across the meadow. There are many gopher holes and vet help is hours away.

### **Dogs:**

- 1) Dogs and other pets are welcome but must be under control at all times.
- 2) No dogs are allowed inside the mess hall.
- 3) As with horses and goats, all dog 'droppings' are to be immediately cleaned up and put into the dumpster or a manure wagon if available.
- 4) Dogs left in camp by horse riders or hikers are to be tied up or otherwise contained.

### **Groups:**

- 1) All payments are to be made by group leader, not by individuals.
- 2) All requests, questions, and other comments are to be made by group leader, not by individuals.

### **Portable Toilets:**

- 1) Portable toilets are available for rent. Locked toilets are not available for use. If used, you will be charged the rental rate of \$50.
- 2) Trash cans are provided for feminine products and other trash.

### **Noise:**

- 1) No excessive noise between 10 PM and 7 AM.
- 2) No generators to be run between 10 PM and 6 AM.

### **Roads:**

- 1) **To keep the dust down, please do not drive over 5 mph on the dirt road.**
- 2) In the big meadow, drive around the edge as there are large dips in the center that can damage your truck/car/ rig.

### **Miscellaneous:**

- 1) No camping within 20 feet of Memorial Tree in middle of big meadow.
- 2) Please treat this campground as you would treat your own property - clean up your own mess.
- 3) There is no maid service. Please sweep out your cabin and discard trash on leaving.
- 4) Please don't cut down trees, dig holes, etc. without prior permission.
- 5) No hunting is allowed on the property.
- 6) Guns may only be fired with permission.

2. **ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSEBACK RIDING, THE HANDLING OF A HORSE OR BEING IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO A HORSE IS AN INHERENTLY DANGEROUS ACTIVITY AND INVOLVES RISKS THAT MAY CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY AND IN SOME CASES DEATH** because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training or past performance.
3. Voluntarily assume the risk and danger of injury or death inherent in the handling or riding of the horse or being in close proximity to a horse or on the premises of the camp or the failure to wear a protective helmet when riding a horse, and use of saddles, bridles, equipment and gear provided to me by Releasees.
4. **RELEASE, DISCHARGE, AND PROMISE NOT TO SUE** the Releasees for any loss, damage injury (including death) or cost to me or my child's arising out of the handling or riding of a horse or being in close proximity to a horse or on the premises of the camp or the failure to wear a protective helmet when riding a horse, and use of saddles, bridles, equipment, and gear provided by Releasees.
5. **INDEMNIFY, AND SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS** the Releasees from and against any loss, liability, damage, or cost they may incur arising out of or in any way connected with either my or my child's handling or riding the horse or being in close proximity to a horse or on the premises of the camp or the failure to wear a protective helmet when riding a horse and/or and use of saddles, bridles, equipment, and gear provided therewith from or contributed to by my or my child's own negligence.
